# Campground Rules & Guidelines

The District Center Board is grateful for our lovely facilities. It is for worship, convenience, and participation of our people across the District. This is a HOLINESS campground. The following directives are for all of us and will give joy to the entire camp:

1. All individuals are asked to conform to modest standards of dress: short shorts and bare midriffs are not allowed. Neat, clean attire shall be worn to religious services. Swimmers are to wear one-piece bathing suits and are to wear a shirt or cover-up to and from the beach.
2. No swimming, fishing, or boating is permitted during regular services, as well as all day Sunday.
3. There is no use of tobacco, drugs, or

intoxicating beverages.

4. Firearms, fireworks, weapons, or other dangerous items are not allowed on the grounds.
5. Pets are allowed in the campgrounds area during Campmeeting week. (See guidelines at Camp Office)
6. During Campmeeting, all campers must register at the Camp Office (4171 Woodland Dr.) between 9am-noon and 1pm-3pm BEFORE occupying the campsite. (First Sunday, 2pm-4pm)
7. No loud music is to be played at any time.
8. PLEASE CHILDREN - No bike riding after 6pm for safety reasons.
9. Curfew will be at 11:30pm.
